Access full-text by opening <u>PubMed</u> in a separate window (it is important to use the link included here or on the library's website). This will trigger Logan's holdings and provide links to the full-text. If you are off-campus or using wireless, when prompted, login with your Logan email credentials. Next, you may click on an article title in InTouch to be led to the abstract online, where available. Select the Logan online icon which will take you directly to the PDF or the publisher's website. To obtain the best quality copy, find the PDF link and click it to pull up the article as it appears in the print issue.

If the abstract leads to a publisher's site instead of PubMed, use the <u>Journal Holdings List</u> to look up the journal and then the article.
